Kenneth W. Hansen, former General Counsel of the Export-Import Bank of the United States, is a partner in Chadbourne & Parke's Washington office.

Mr. Hansen was appointed General Counsel of the Export-Import Bank by President Clinton in 1995. The Export-Import Bank is the official export credit agency of the United States, providing financial support for U.S. exports, primarily to emerging markets.

Prior to joining the Export-Import Bank, Mr. Hansen was of counsel in the Washington office of Baker & Botts. He also spent nine years with the Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC), the U.S. agency that provides project financing and political risk insurance in connection with private sector projects in emerging markets, where he was Associate General Counsel for Investment.

Mr. Hansen is a 1974 graduate of Harvard College and a 1983 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He also holds a master's degree in International Relations from Yale University and a master's degree in Public Administration from Harvard's Kennedy School of Government.

Mr. Hansen has taught economics and finance at a number of institutions, including Bryn Mawr College, Harvard University, Haverford College, Wellesley College, Boston University Law School's Morin Center for International and Financial Law Studies, the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy at Tufts University, George Washington University Law School, and Georgetown University Law Center. He has also written and spoken widely.
